Dear Friend

I wonder how many of you watched any of the Methodist Conference online. I was particularly encouraged and challenged by the addresses from our new President and Vice President who have taken as their theme this year: "Learn to do right, seek justice and defend the oppressed"

1. Being a presence in our communities

To quote the president: 'Our policies regarding our use of funds must be shaped and led by our justice seeking church agenda. When we give up church buildings in communities caught in that web of poverty we should be more willing to create roles for people to live and work in communities the church has otherwise withdrawn from. This is happening in some locations but perhaps not sufficiently frequently or part of a vision for how we should engage with communities. The buildings we have closed are often in communities with lowest incomes and poorest service provision. The buildings may be unsuitable and not fit for purpose but people participating in the lives of lower income communities are needed, not for the evangelisation of those living with poverty- the reverse. When we are present in these communities we might well be the first recipients of the expertise, gifts and knowledge that those living in poverty in that location possess. Our Church at the Margins work in the Methodist Church shares core values of celebration, inclusion and participation, 'We recognise our need for the gifts of those at the economic margins and believe the whole Church needs to receive these gifts in order to be fully transformed by the gospel of Christ'.'

2. Being open to diversity

The Vice – President shared the following words: 'My own experience is of people assuming that, if I just tried harder and put in a bit of effort, I would be able to spell better or do other things my dyslexia makes more challenging. What people are so often saying is that, if only you would try harder and put more effort in you could be more like me. Wouldn't life be dull if we were all the same and all thought and responded to life and faith in the same way!

In the Walking with Micah report there is the quote from John Wesley's Sermon 39 that says "Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may." This is not just true where we differ in our political or theological thinking, but also in the more fundamental aspects of thinking and cognitive processing.

We do not all experience faith in the same way and we do not all need to do church in the same way. The joy of being a Connexional church is the rich diversity that makes up who we are'.

Help birds in hot weather. Keeping your bird bath topped up with fresh water in warmer weather can be a life saver for our feathered friends. Get your garden birds through a heatwave when natural supplies, like worms, become scarce, by putting out supplementary food - black sunflower seeds, pinhead oatmeal, soaked sultanas, raisins and currants, mealworms, waxworms and good seed mixture.

Godly Play as Bible Study

Story is one of the most ancient forms of knowing. It is the way our Christian heritage has been passed down to us. And story forms the foundation of Godly Play. It invites you to sit as part of a circle and listen as the stories of the Bible are told through word and action. It allows you to immerse yourself in the stories as an act of meditation and prayer and ultimately to encounter God. As the stories are told you sit and listen and at the end of the storytelling you are invited to consider a number of 'I wonder questions'. Questions posed by the storyteller that ask you to reflect on what you have heard. Questions like:

I wonder what part of the story was most important to you? Or

I wonder where you are in the story?

Or

I wonder if there is a part of the story we can leave out and still have all the story we need?

There are no right or wrong answers to any of the questions, they are a means by which you are invited to wonder deeply about the story and what it says to you. Then when the story is put away there is time to respond to all that you have heard and wondered about. It may be that you want to reread the story again for yourself, paint, draw, model or write a response - the choice is entirely yours.

At the end of the response time we gather back together for refreshments before drawing our time together to an end. If this is something you think you might like to try then our next Godly play session will take place on Monday, 12th August at 6.30 pm at Wolstanton Methodist Church. Come and see, wonder, and reflect deeply about stories you

thought you knew.

There is a new free book swop library outside Bradwell Methodist Church. Please take a look and if you have any unwanted books please pop them in.




